The Soul of your child is like an uncut precious jewel entrusted into your care by Allah. To you is given the awesome responsibility of shaping that precious jewel into a beautiful form, pleasing to the eye of Allah.

Dear Parents,

Today the most challenging task is that of parenting i.e grooming the next generation, our beloved children. We find many books in the market on upbringing of children and training manuals to help parents with this task. Parents run from pillar to post to educate, groom and make their children successful in life.

The efforts begin with play-school and proceed to nursery, regular schooling, tuitions, special coaching classes, abacus classes, karate classes, public speaking courses, personality development classes, coaching for competitive exams, sporting competitions to admission to professional colleges. All of this leads to a grueling time for the parents. At the same time they have to cope with the unending list of demands from their children accompanied with issues like depression, suicidal tendencies, drug abuse, alcoholism, anger, pornography, dangerous sexual behaviour, the constant fear of elopement and involvement in crimes etc. In spite of their sincere love, care and efforts the fear of being abondened during old age stares at their face.

Dear Parents , the holy Quran is a complete book of guidance, helping the Momin to stay on the right path, the path of those favoured by Allah such as the Prophets, Siddiqueen and the Righteous. The Quran we know guides us in all the aspects of life and in the various roles and responsibility we need to fulfill in our lives. In this booklet let us make an effort to understand the parenting responsibility and the effective measures and tips the Quran and the lives of the Prophets give us on the subject.

UNDERSTANDING THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN PARENTS AND CHILDREN

To begin with one needs to know the right attitude the parents should have towards their children and how they understand the relationship that exists between themselves and their children.

O ye who believe! Ward off from yourselves and your families a Fire whereof the fuel is men and stones. (Quran 66:6)

The Prophet (pbuh) said, "Every new born has the correct instinct, his parents make him Jewish, Christian or a fire worshipper."

Allah's Apostle, PBUH also said: "Every one of your (people) is a shepherd. And every one is responsible for whatever falls under his responsibility. A man is like a shepherd of his own family, and he is responsible for them". This Hadith is reported by both Bukhari and Muslim.

'Ali bin Abi Talhah (r.a) reported from Ibn 'Abbas (r.a): "Work in the obedience of Allah, avoid disobedience of Allah <u>and order</u> <u>your families to remember Allah</u>, then Allah will save you from the Fire"

Ayyub ibn Musa(r.a) said that the Messenger of Allah, may Allah bless him and grant him peace, said, "A parent cannot give his child a better gift than good manners."

The above guidelines of the Quran and the sayings of Prophet state the responsibility of the the father first and then as a team as parents towards their children.

<u>The child is a gift from Allah</u> (swt) and in many verses the Quran announces the arrival of the child as good news and glad tidings.

The angels called out to him while he was standing in prayer in the Upper Room, 'Allah gives you the good news of Yahya,...

... We gave him the good news of an intelligent lad." (37:99-101)

O Mary! Lo! Allah giveth thee glad tidings of a word from him, whose name is the Messiah, Jesus, (3:44)

So We gave him tidings of a gentle son. (37;100)

It is no wonder that the term "good news" is always used in respect of the divine gift of children. Children are a natural help to man both in his life and after his death. They are the candles which illuminate his life and give it meaning and value.

"Wealth and sons are the embellishment of the life of this world." (18:46)

"We fortified you with wealth and children and made you greater in number." (17:6)

"Fear Him who has sustained you in ways you know about, sustained you with pasturing animals and children, and with gardens and clear springs." (26:132-134)

And his wife, standing by laughed when We gave her good tidings (of the birth) of Isaac . (11:70)

Then we gave you once again your turn against them, and We aided you with wealth and children and made you more in soldiery. (17:5)

And who say: Our Lord! Vouchsafe us comfort of our wives and of our offspring, and make us patterns for (all) those who ward off (evil) (25:73)

CHILDREN ARE A MEANS TO ATTAIN JANNAH

Moreover, Allah's Apostle, PBUH said: "Upon death, man's deeds will (definitely) stop except for three deeds, namely: a continuous charitable fund, endowment or goodwill; knowledge left for people to benefit from; and pious righteous and God-fearing child who continuously pray Allah, the Almighty, for the soul of his parents. "This Hadith is reported by Muslim.

The Prophet (pbuh) once said, "He who provides good upbringing to 3 daughters shall go to Paradise".

"A servant will have his rank raised and will say, 'O my Lord how has this come about for me?' He says, 'through your sons after you seeking forgiveness for you'" (ibn Maajah)

The child Allah says is also a trial and trust

"And know that your possessions and your children are a test..." (8:27)

"O you who believe! Let not your properties or your children divert you from the remembrance of Allah. And whosoever does that, they are the losers".

You will find the statement of the Prophet: "Whoever loves something is punished by it,"

Lo! We have placed all that is in the earth as an ornament thereof that <u>We may try them</u>: which of them is best in conduct. (18:6)

Beautified for mankind is love of the joys (that come) from women and offspring; and stored-up heaps of gold and silver, and horses branded (with their mark), and cattle and land. That is comfort of the life of the world. Allah! With Him is a more excellent abode. (3:13)

"Do not admire their wealth and their children. Allah merely desires to punish them by them during the life of this world, and for their souls to depart while they are still rejectors." (9:55)

"Say: 'If your fathers or your sons or your brothers or your wives or your tribe, or any wealth you have acquired, or any business you fear may decline, or any dwellings which please you, are dearer to you than Allah and His Messenger and performing jihad in His way, then wait until Allah brings about His command. Allah does not guide people who are wantonly deviant.'" (9:24)

WHAT DO THE CHILDREN NEED

Love and Compassion

Among the noble feelings which Allah has placed in the hearts of parents is a feeling of mercy towards children, compassion for them and kindness to them. They are a determining factor in their guidance and training, care and nourishment.

The Prophet (pbuh) said about mercy, "He who has no mercy will not be shown mercy."

'Amr ibn Shu'ayb, may Allah be pleased with him, related that the Messenger of Allah, may Allah bless him and grant him peace, said, "Anyone who does not show mercy to our young people or acknowledge the rights of our old people is not one of us."

A person was embracing his child. Prophet Muhammad (pbuh) asked him, "Do you feel compassion for the child?"

"yes, I do", was the polite reply. He said, "Allah is merciful to you more than you are to the child. He is the most Merciful (of those who show mercy)" [Bukhari].

There is no doubt that when there is mercy in the hearts of parents it is a help from Allah to assist them to bring up their children in a way that will please Allah and His Messenger.

Guidance and counseling

A fathers' teaching his child good manners is better than giving a bushel of grain (in charity)" (Bukhari).

A man came to 'Umar ibn al-Khattab, may Allah be pleased with him, to complain to him about his son's disobedience. 'Umar (r.a) summoned the boy and upbraided him for disobeying his father and neglecting his duties.

"Amir al-Mu'minin," said the man's son, "doesn't a son have any rights over his father?"

"Yes, he does," replied 'Umar.

"What are they, Amir al-Mu'minin?"

"That he chooses his mother carefully, gives him a good name, and teaches him the Book (i.e. the Qur'an)."

"Amir al-Mu'minin, my father did not do any of these things.

My mother was a black woman who belonged to a Magian. He named me Ju'al (dung beetle) and did not teach me a single letter of the Qur'an."

'Umar turned to the man and said to him, "You come to me to complain about the disobedience of your son when you betrayed him before he ever betrayed you and were bad to him before he was ever bad to you!"

'Umar made the father responsible for his son's disobedience because he had neglected his upbringing and care in the light of the wise method of Allah and His upright *Shari'a*.

Protection and care

Messenger of Allah, may Allah bless him and grant him peace said, "Out of a dinar you spend in the way of Allah and a dinar you spend to free a slave and a dinar you give to the poor and a dinar you spend on your family, the one with the greatest reward is the one you spend on your family."

The prophet said, "When a man spends out on behalf of his family and sincerely hopes to be rewarded for it, it counts as sadaqa,"

Jabir ibn Samura, may Allah be pleased with him, said that the Messenger of Allah, may Allah bless him and grant him peace, said, "It is a better for man to teach his son than to give away a sa' in sadaga."

The Messenger of Allah, may Allah bless him and grant him peace, said, I'lf he goes out to strive on behalf of his young children, he is fighting in the Way of Allah.

"Kill not your children for fear of want: We shall provide sustainance for them as well as for you. Verily the killing of them is a great sin" (17:30)

Children will become what we want them to be if we are what we want them to be

The following verses of the Quran describes the concern the prophets had in imparting deen to their children and their lives were models and we know a child loves to follow his fathers footsteps.

"Ibrahim directed his sons to this, as did Ya'qub: 'My sons! Allah has chosen this deen for you, so do not die except as Muslims who submit.' Or were you present when death came to Ya'qub and he said to his sons, 'What will you worship after me?' They said, 'We will worship your God, the God of your fathers, Ibrahim and Isma'il and Ishaq -One God. We are Muslims submitted to Him.'" (2: 132-133)

A parent needs to ponder over the following saying of the prophet.

He said, "None of you will believe until I am dearer to him than his wealth, his child and all people." (Al-Bukhari and Muslim). This identifies the attitude a parent should have towards life. Only if a parent has this attitude will he be in a position to fulfill the responsibility of parenting. The love for prophet is manifested in the love for deen.

The Almighty says in His Noble Book: "Say: 'If your fathers or your sons or your brothers or your wives or your tribe, or any wealth you have acquired, or any business you fear may decline, or places to live which please you, are dearer to you than Allah and His Messenger and jihad in His way, then wait until Allah brings about His command. Allah does not guide the wantonly deviant:" (9:24)

Now that we have established the right attitude towards children and the parents relationship with the children let us move on for some ground work and re-structuring our lives.

So if we want pious children then those same qualities should be manifested in our lives. We will have to be dutiful towards Allah and His messenger. We will have stay away from all things disliked in Islam and inculcate such qualities as being good and helpful to family and relatives, friends and neighbors, poor and needy, avoid talking ill of others and all other vices. Spend our wealth and ability in the cause of Allah.



There are various means of guiding or reforming ones wife, such as:

- To prepare and program the wife for the Islamic mission of life which includes the knowledge of the Quran & Seerat
- Paying attention to correcting her worship of Allah in all its aspects, as will be discussed in detail below.
- **E** Striving to strengthen her eemaan, such as:
 - Encouraging her to pray at night (qiyaam al-layl)
 - Encouraging her to read Qur'an
 - Encouraging her to memorize adhikaar (remembrance of Allah)
 and remember the appropriate times and occasions for saying
 them
 - Encouraging her to give charity
 - Encouraging her to read useful Islamic books



- Encouraging her to listen to useful Islamic cassettes that can increase knowledge and strengthen eemaan – and continuing to supply her with them.
- Choosing good, religious friends for her, with whom she can form ties of sisterhood and have good conversations and purposeful visits.
- Protecting her from evil and blocking off all avenues for it to reach her, by keeping her away from bad companions and bad places.
- To seek knowledge of current issues and contemporary subjects.
- He should also focus on guiding his family to lead a simple life and to be hospitable towards relatives and neighbors
- To use good speech and mannerisms

The Prophet (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) said: "May Allah have mercy on a man who gets up at night and prays, then he wakes up his wife to pray, and if she refuses he throws water in her face." (Reported by Ahmad and Abu Dawood. Sahih al-Jaami', 3488).

IMPORTANT STAGES OF ISLAMIC PARENTING

Before arrival & on confirmation of Pregnancy

- Equip yourself with knowledge
- Focus on cleanliness
- Do not fight and argue

Avoid using raised voices and rude speech

- Tell no lies and make no false promises
- Use of words such as Bismillah, Al Hamdu lillah, Suban Allah, Insha Allah, Masha Allah etc.
- Do not miss your Namaz & try to perform more Nawafils
- Regularly recite and study the Quran
- Zikr & Astagfar should be constant
- Stay away from rude people & avoid loose talks
- Be active in intellectual activity such as reading, writing etc.

AFTER BIRTH

- Give a good name and do Aqiqah
- Emphasis on hygiene, cleanliness
- Be patient & calm with the newborn
- Always respond to child's cry and his/her needs
- Make it a habit to hum a hamd, dua & verses from the quran to the child
- Teach words like Allah, Rasool etc.
- Breast feeding is the best nutrient for your baby
- Avoid bottle feeds
- Play Islamic rhymes for the child
- Keep the child away from TV & Cartoons





AS THE CHILD GROWS

- Teach him/her Ettiquettes of eating
- Teach him/her Food and table manners
- Teach him/her wash room habits & personal hygien
- Teach him/her cleanliness and hygiene
 Train him/her to be neat and tidy

 Advocate him/her of the ill-offects of junk food

 $Advocate\,him/her\,of\,the\,ill-effects\,of\,junk\,food.$

- Should have knowledge of the Prophets (pbut) of Allah, Islamic history and Islamic personalities etc.


DEVELOPING INTELLECTUAL ACTIVITY

- Arouse curiosity in all walks of life, be it the animal kingdom, our geography etc.
- Visits to Museums/ Planetariums & Historical sites
- Visits to Dams/ Factories & Energy plants etc.
- Explaining the behaviour and actions of different groups of people
- Talk about current affairs, local issues and explain about news reports, their causes and effects on day to day life.
- Make the child comfortable with all forms of technologies.

APPEAL TO HIS REASONS

 The child should not only be asked to perform certain duties but also be explained the need to do so.

Eg. Give reasons why you should not stray away from home and walk only on the footpath?



- Be ready to answer any questions or clarify any doubts they might have
- Train to judge personality by appearance, speech and mannerisms

DO NOT CONFUSE THEM

- Do not give conflicting instructions
- Do not give preference for one child over the other
- Do not have double standards of punishment of rewarding and gifting



CHARACTER CORRECTION

- Do not scold over every little mistake
- Do not beat for accidently dropping or breaking but express support and comfort
- Incentive induced correction and no corporal punishment
- No hard lining towards adopting Islamic practices (develops rebellion)
- For complaints against the child give them a chance to apologize and to reimburse loss from his/her savings
- Give explanation of the impact of their mistakes
- Anger is not a short cut to reform your child

GUIDE LINES ON BODY AND SEXUALITY

- Follow the Islamic etiquettes of dressing
- Not to expose body in front of others
- Not to allow others to play with their body
- Do not leave your children under the care of servants

Don't Make Them SOFT!!

- Encourage your child to be practical
- Let Initial playful activities lead to competitive sports and daily exercise
- Make your child outdoorsy
- Teach him routine repairs and maintenance
- Let them do household errands
- Instill in him confidence but not pride







SAFETY AND PRECAUTIONS





- Teach him traffic rules and sense
- Caution him about inflammable items, electric appliances, poisonous household chemicals etc.
- NO bikes/cars before prescribed age limits
- Carry an ID and contact number

TV/INTERNET/VIDEO AND MOBILE PHONES

To minimize the potential negative effects of television, it's important to understand what the impact of television can be on children. Below you will find information on some areas of concern.

LETHARGY/OBESITY/VIOLENCE/DANGEROUS SEXUAL BEHAVIOUR

While people generally feel more energized after playing sports or engaging in hobbies, after watching TV they usually feel depleted of energy. TV viewing is a sedentary activity, and has been proven to be a significant factor in childhood obesity. Television can affect learning and school performance if it cuts into the time kids need for activities crucial to healthy mental and physical development.

Kids today are bombarded with sexual messages and images in all media—television, magazines, advertisements, music, movies and the Internet. New research is showing that teenagers' exposure to sexual content in the media may be responsible for earlier onset of sexual intercourse or other sexual activities.

The young children are more likely to exhibit aggressive behaviour after viewing violent TV shows or movies. Some of the most violent TV shows are children's cartoons, in which violence is portrayed as humorous—and realistic consequences of violence are seldom shown. This exposure may contribute significantly to childhood and adolescent obesity, poor nutrition, and cigarette and alcohol use. Conclusion: Use of tv/internet etc should strictly guarded and controlled and a total no for closed door viewing for children.

MOBILE PHONES FOR CHILDREN: A BOON OR A PERIL

In a world where everyone is busy texting and chatting, more and more parents believe that their little ones should join the fun. In spite of dire warnings about the long-term harm that mobile phone use may wreak on young children's mental and physical health. A disturbing study last year indicated that children may be five times more likely to get brain cancer if they use mobile phones. 40 per cent of children with mobile phones are sleep deprived, as peer pressure has made it normal for children to stay up until the early hours texting friends.

Parents should ensure their children use mobile phones only when absolutely necessary and parents have a responsibility to their children not simply to throw a mobile phone to a young child, and say off you go'.

FINAL COUNSEL

- If you cannot reform yourself, make separate arrangements for the child's care with responsible individuals.
- Keep child away from foul mouthed and boastful characters in the family
- Keep inquiring of playtime activities and new friends
- Parents groom the child
- Be upfront & honest with the child at all times.

We have in the above pages seen the effective method to groom and mould our children One practical difficulty though is choosing the right school until we as a community set up Islamic schools. Jamaat-e-Islami Hind has taken note of this issue and has made efforts in this direction by organising Children Islamic Circle, summer and winter vacation camps, conducting certificate and diploma courses in Islamic studies through the Board of Islamic Education at different places in Goa. It has also been conducting awareness programs and counseling sessions on effective parenting. However these efforts need to be streamlined and made more effective to reach out to a wider section of our society. This can be fulfilled only when there exists involvement and co-operation of the parents.

Jamaat-e-Islami Hind – Goa shall be conducting weekly sunday classes of two hours each for children in the age group of 9 to 12 from the month of July 2011. During these classes an effort shall be made to acquaint the children with the basics of Islam, the Prophet and his companions, Islamic manners and morals, Islamic values and etiquettes, Islamic prayers and Dua's, Islamic personalities and an all round personality development. The classes shall also include educational trips and excursions. The syllabus is designed keeping in mind the needs of the Muslim children and by the application of modern methodology and teaching techniques.

The teachers shall be specially coached and trained regularly to make the teaching more effective. Parents are requested to buy a set of the syllabus.

During the Academic year beginning from July 2011 to June 2012 we have only 52 Sundays and few public holidays and we need to make best use of it and plan to make sure that our children do not miss even one class as missing a class creates a void of 15 days and a child might lose his or her focus on the subject. As Parents it is our responsibility to co-ordinate with the teacher to ensure fruitfulness of the classes. We will have to take a keen interest and involve ourselves with the child to make the learning process more effective.
